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

Results:

- 15 surveys handed out to patients/families.
- 10/15 Responded.
- Question #1: 90% Yes
- Question #2: 90% No
- Question #3: 90% Yes
- Question #4: 90% Yes

DISCUSSION:

- Results at face value indicate strongly favorable leanings towards a SLP-Dietitian team approach. Comments included:
- "It helps to see them together, so they can catch what one problem creates for the other"
- "Both needs can be met when any two disciplines present together as long as one person is willing to listen to questions outside their specialty."

Results/Discussion:

- "You work well together."
- "Speech-language more of an issue now than swallowing."

Conclusions/Considerations

- Providing a team approach with compatible disciplines may improve patient satisfaction of the clinic visit.
- When implementing the 'Two Heads are Better than One' approach, compatibility of the providers is essential.
