 Several ALS/MND patients participated, and shared their life stories.




The 2011 Dreams Come True Program

 - Visiting the highest mountain of Taiwan
 - Having a belated wedding party
 - Moving back home

- Mr. Cheng was born at a small village under Mt.
 Jade — the highest mountain of Taiwan.
- He has always thought that, someday in his life, he would climb up to the top Mt. Jade to enjoy the breathtaking views.



- About a year ago, Cheng started having symptoms of ALS, but fortunately he is still able to speak clearly and walk for thirty minutes without assistance.
- His compromised wish is to go to the entrance of Mt. Jade National Park, as long as his health permits.
- He passed medical evaluations for taking the excursion to a high altitude.



- Plan for the trip was meticulously made:
 - Consultations with primary doctors, respiratory therapists, nurses, social workers, and other medical professionals.
 - Arrangements of midsize shuttles and ambulances, etc.

- Having lived under 24hr care for more than 10 years, her wish now is to move back home, in the removed country of Taiwan.

 - Fundraising
 - Preliminary investigations of medical resources around her hometown
 - Holding meetings with those concerned
