Fear of initiating the conversation

What if practitioner doesn't have the answers?

Managing unrealistic expectations



Conversation may change professional relationship

Doing more damage

Pitching conversation at the right level

Patient/family may not want the discussion

Benefits



Build trusting, therapeutic relationship

A relief to talk

Opportunity for questions

Empowers the person



Clarity for professionals, patients, carers

Reduce fear of dying process

Helps with planning ahead

Reassures person they have a voice
